Beta Beta Epsilon is the UW-Madison chapter of Beta Phi Mu, the international library science honor society. Only LIS graduates with the strongest academic credentials are inducted into Beta Phi Mu.

The Clarke Scholarship will be presented Spring semester 2008 to one student who shows exceptional promise in pursuing a career in library and information studies. The winning candidate will also receive special recognition at the annual Beta Phi Mu Initiation Rite and Reception in May 2008.

Candidates must:

- Be enrolled in SLIS for Spring 2008
- Have completed at least 12 SLIS credits by 12/31/07
- Have a GPA of 3.7 or above
- Demonstrate scholarly ability, interest in pursuing a career in library and information studies, and leadership qualities

Applicants must submit the following, labelled "Jack A. Clarke Scholarship Application":

- Cover sheet: Name, address, e-mail, and phone number
- List of SLIS courses completed and grades received, and a list of Fall 2007 and/or Spring 2008 course enrollment
- Resumé including description of library-related experience, professional development (including organization/committee memberships or offices held) and other work, volunteer or educational activities
- Letter from one faculty member or practicing information professional citing evidence of your scholarly and leadership abilities
- Essay of no more than 3 double-spaced pages describing your career aspirations
- Individual paper or project reflecting your best work (no group papers or projects)
